Grant Funding Cycle

- Grants are for the 2018-2019 school year.
- Funds should be spent between July 16, 2018 and October 2, 2018.
- If funds are for a project or materials that will not be paid for by October 2nd please specify in the application (e.g., field trips, subscriptions, professional development).

Grant Scoring Process

- Members of the Nassau Education Foundation Grant Committee reader panel will score all grant applications.
- Each application will be independently scored by at least three panelists.
- The total scores from each reader will be added up and divided by three to determine an average score.
- A moderator will meet with grant readers to review their scores.
- The three highest scoring grants from each school will be awarded provided they meet all criteria and funds are available.
- After the top scoring grants from each school have been distributed, awards will continue in rank order until the Nassau Education Foundation 2018-2019 grant funds are depleted.

Grant Disqualifications

- Grants submitted for prohibited items, such as food, furniture and incentives, will be disqualified.
- If the overall project concept does not enhance or support existing curriculum or provide additional learning experiences, it will be disqualified.
